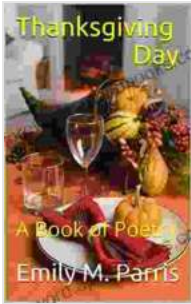

pastry And pumpkin-pies of gold!

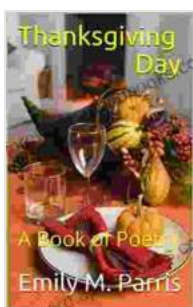
With cranberry sauce and pickles And nuts and wine and cheese, The table

warmth and gratitude on this special day.



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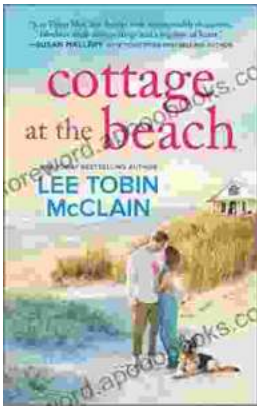
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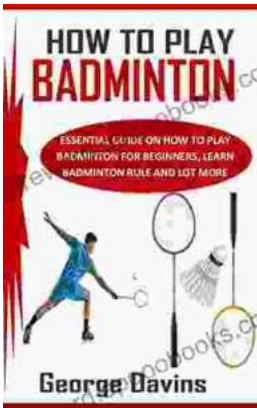
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
